Grouper Education Program

The Grouper Moon Project is a collaborative conservation program between Reef Environmental Education Foundation (REEF) and the Cayman Islands Department of the Environment (CIDOE), studying Nassau Grouper– a social and ecological corner stone of Caribbean coral reefs. In 2011, we began the implementation of a curriculum designed for both elementary and high school students. This exciting new project focuses on bringing the Nassau Grouper into classrooms through lesson plans and live-feed videos that connect classrooms with scientists in the field.

An Innovative Marine-Sciences Curriculum:

The curriculum presents a multi-faceted view of the Nassau Grouper and includes historical, scientific, and conser-

vation concepts. The program culminates with live-feed video sessions during the winter spawning event. Students engage with scientists live and underwater, directly from the Little Cayman aggregation site with 7000+ Nassau Grouper, allowing us to bring real world field science into the classroom.

Workshop Content:

During this afternoon, hands-on workshop, educators will learn the following:

- How to effectively implement the Grouper Education Program (GEP) curriculum with students in both elementary (Year 4-13) and high school classrooms.
- Working knowledge of the key historical, scientific, and conservation concepts about Nassau Grouper.
- An understanding of the coral reef ecosystem, specifically the vital role that fish diversity and the presence of top predators such as the Nassau Grouper play in maintaining a healthy reef.
- Technical training in utilizing the GEP blog (www.groupereducation.edublogs.org), the live video-conferencing website, digital video cameras, and your own web camera.



Educators will also receive access to program and technical support.

Workshop Details:

- The GEP Workshops are open to all Cayman Island educators. There are a limited number of spaces for educators from other countries.
- Two separate workshops will be held: Thursday, Nov. 28 on Grand Cayman. Location: John Gray High School and Friday, Nov. 29 on Cayman Brac. Location: Spot Bay Primary
- Participants will receive: a complete set of the GEP curriculum and access to ongoing support from REEF scientists and educators.
- Cost to participate: FREE.
